Jobs Bills Take Shape, Election Performance Task Force Reports, Eyewitness ID Investigated on CT-N *Capitol Report: Week in Review*

Hartford, CT – Starting at 7 p.m. this Friday, Connecticut Network viewers can catch up on preparations for the legislature’s upcoming jobs special session on the latest episode of *Capitol Report: Week in Review*. The Finance, Revenue and Bonding Committee holds a hearing today to hear public comment on several job-creation proposals, including one bringing Maine-based Jackson Laboratory to Connecticut and establishing a \$1.1 billion bioscience lab at the UConn Health Center. This is the latest step in the fine-tuning process for the bills that will be taken up in the special legislative session.

Capitol Report this week also includes highlights from Wednesday’s Election Performance Task force meeting, where the group convened by Secretary of the State Denise Merrill issued its draft report on potential improvements to Connecticut’s electoral system. This episode also includes excerpts from yesterday’s Eyewitness Identification Task Force meeting – where national expert Dr. Gary Wells characterized the differences between simultaneous and sequential police lineups – and other events in state government this week.

Capitol Report: Week in Review summarizes the activity at the State Capitol during the week, using voice over and graphics to combine history, context, and next steps in the process with full-length excerpts from the week’s proceedings. The program premieres on CT-N every Friday night at 7:00 p.m., then rebroadcasts at Noon and 7:00 p.m. on Saturdays, 8:00 p.m. on Sundays, and 6:00 a.m. Monday mornings; check CT-N’s online program schedule for additional airtimes. Each episode runs between 30 and 60 minutes.

All episodes of *Capitol Report* are available online, in keeping with the network’s seamless integration of telecast and interactive content. Visit www.ct-n.com/CR for OnDemand and podcast downloads of each episode, annotated with synopses and links to related gavel-to-gavel coverage.
