### **Witt Report Assesses Power Restoration, Redistricting Moves Forward, Teacher Education Dialogue Begins on CT-N *Capitol Report: Week in Review***

Hartford, CT – Starting at 7 p.m. this Friday, Connecticut Network viewers can see the latest milestone in the state’s post-storm analysis during the latest episode of *Capitol Report: Week in Review*. Governor Malloy released a report by Witt Associates on Thursday, which investigated the power restoration responses by Connecticut Light & Power and United Illuminating during Tropical Storm Irene and Winter Storm Alfred earlier this year. The Witt Report’s publication comes as the state’s Two-Storm panel continues its work toward a January deadline for making legislative recommendations to improve the state’s overall storm responses in the future.

*Capitol Report* this week also includes highlights from Wednesday’s Redistricting Commission meeting which included votes taken on proposed changes to the state’s General Assembly districts following the 2010 Census. This episode also includes excerpts from Monday’s listening session at CCSU with Education Commissioner Stefan Pryor and Governor Malloy – which focused on the effectiveness of teacher preparation programs and the correlation between teacher training and the achievement gap – and other events in state government this week.

*Capitol Report: Week in Review* summarizes the activity at the State Capitol during the week, using voice over and graphics to combine history, context, and next steps in the process with full-length excerpts from the week’s proceedings. The program premieres on CT-N every Friday night at 7:00 p.m., then rebroadcasts at Noon and 7:00 p.m. on Saturdays, 8:00 p.m. on Sundays, and 6:00 a.m. Monday mornings; check CT-N’s online program schedule for additional airtimes. Each episode runs between 30 and 60 minutes.
