### **Governor Malloy Addresses Budget Shortfall as Rail Bathroom Plans Circle the Drain on *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review***

Hartford, CT – Starting at 7 p.m. Friday, Connecticut Network viewers will learn how Governor Dannel Malloy plans to deal with homelessness and a growing state budget deficit on this week's episode of *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review*.

The latest estimate of the state budget deficit came in this week at \$121 million, triggering Governor Malloy to announce action in dealing with the shortfall. This estimate comes two months after the Governor made \$50 million in concessions in dealing with the deficit and just a couple of weeks before he announces his budget proposals for the next year. The Governor also continued his push for transportation initiatives throughout the state by holding a briefing in New Haven on Tuesday. At the briefing his Transportation Commissioner James Redeker explained his department's reasoning behind not having restrooms at some of the state's new, incoming rail stations. *Capitol Report* will review the Governor's comments on the budget deficit, Commissioner Redeker's reasoning and new efforts in the state's fight against homelessness.

This week's episode will also discuss a meeting amongst the Black and Puerto Rican Caucus where members heard testimony and discussed a wide array of priorities for the 2015 Legislative Session. This meeting comes the same week as the annual Connecticut Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Ceremony, which was held at the State Capitol on Monday.

*Capitol Report: Week in Review* summarizes the activity at the State Capitol during the week, using voice over and graphics to combine history, context, and next steps in the process with full-length excerpts from the week's proceedings. The program premieres on CT-N every Friday night at 7:00 p.m., then rebroadcasts at Noon and 7:00 p.m. on Saturdays, 8:00 p.m. on Sundays, and 6:00 a.m. Monday mornings; check CT-N's online program schedule for additional airtimes. Each episode runs between 30 and 60 minutes.
