### **Governor & Legislative Leaders on Both Sides Put Forward Proposals on *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review***

Hartford, CT – Starting at 7 p.m. Friday, Connecticut Network viewers will recap a week that included a number of legislative proposals from both sides of the aisle and reconfirmation hearings for a flock of state agency leaders on this week's episode of *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review*.

A number of legislative proposals were put forward for consideration this week by Governor Dannel Malloy and legislative leaders from both parties. The Governor announced initiatives designed to protect the Long Island Sound and increase the use of solar energy in the state. Meanwhile, his Democratic colleagues in the Senate discussed ways to protect consumers from data breaches, such as the Anthem Health Insurance cyberattack that occurred just last week. Across the aisle, Republican leaders from the House and Senate presented a plan for funding future transportation projects a week before Governor Malloy lays out his two year budget plan on Budget Day next Wednesday, February 18.

This week's episode will review the reconfirmation hearings for a bevy of state department heads, including Department of Children & Families (DCF) Commissioner Joette Katz and Department of Emergency Services & Protection (DESPP) Commissioner Dora Schriro.

*Capitol Report* will also discuss the Transportation Committee's public hearings on more than a hundred proposed bills, the testimony heard by the Aging Committee in regard to caretaker support and a controversial proposal discussed amongst the Insurance Committee that would affect pitbull owners trying to get insurance coverage.

*Capitol Report: Week in Review* summarizes the activity at the State Capitol during the week, using voice over and graphics to combine history, context, and next steps in the process with full-length excerpts from the week's proceedings. The program premieres on CT-N every Friday night at 7:00 p.m., then rebroadcasts at Noon and 7:00 p.m. on Saturdays, 8:00 p.m. on Sundays, and 6:00 a.m. Monday mornings; check CT-N's online program schedule for additional airtimes. Each episode runs between 30 and 60 minutes.
