Fallout from Governor's Budget Revisions & Tribes' Vision for Casino Expansion on *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review*

Hartford, CT – This Friday at 7 p.m., Connecticut Network viewers will recap a week where reactions to Governor Dannel Malloy's budget revisions continued to pour in, visions were laid out for casino expansion and the state's job growth numbers were revealed on the latest episode of *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review*.

Fallout from Governor Malloy's proposed revisions to the biennial budget continued this week as various groups and organizations, including human services providers and clients, held events to discuss the changes that will be taken up during the upcoming Special Session. Meanwhile, the Governor continued highlighting major transportation projects taking place throughout the state by announcing a completion timeframe for a highway project that has been affecting commuters on I-95 for more than a decade. The Governor also commented this week on Connecticut's latest job growth report and job cuts announced by Hartford Healthcare during a briefing at Vineyard Vines headquarters in Stamford.

Capitol Report will also discuss the latest vision laid out by the chairmen of the Mohegan and Mashantucket Pequot Councils for a possible third casino in Connecticut and will look ahead to the impending Special Session, which does not yet have an official start date.
