### **2017 Legislative Session, Care4Kids Program and Spending Cap Commission on *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review***

**Hartford, CT** – This Friday at 7 p.m., Connecticut Network viewers will recap a busy public speaking schedule for Governor Malloy, the work being done to save the Care4Kids program, and the last meeting of the Spending Cap Commission on this week's episode of *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review*.

[Governor Dannel Malloy](#) maintained a busy public speaking schedule this week as he begins to look ahead to the 2017 Legislative Session which is set to begin on January 4th. During his engagements with state business leaders, legislators and advocacy groups he set out his priorities and vision for Connecticut's future. Back at the State Capitol a legislative working group began work to find the money needed to save the [Care4Kids](#) program, which has been forced to close enrollment due to a state budget deficiency. Meanwhile, the [Spending Cap Commission](#) met one last time to try and reach an agreement on what should be counted under the state spending cap when crafting a new budget.

*Capitol Report* will also review the comments made by Connecticut Supreme Court Chief Justice Chase Rogers as she honored fellow [Justice Peter Zarella](#) who is set to retire from the court on December 30.

*Capitol Report: Week in Review* summarizes the activity at the State Capitol during the week, using voice over and graphics to combine history, context, and next steps in the process with full-length excerpts from the week's proceedings. The program premieres on CT-N every Friday night at 7:00 p.m., then rebroadcasts at Noon and 7:00 p.m. on Saturdays, 8:00 p.m. on Sundays, and 6:00 a.m. Monday mornings; check CT-N's online program schedule for additional airtimes.
