### **Confirmation Hearings, Redevelopment in Preston, and Honoring MLK on *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review***

**Hartford, CT** – This Friday at 7 p.m., Connecticut Network viewers will recap confirmation hearings for a number of nominees tapped for state jobs, redevelopment plans for a former hospital site in Preston, and a ceremony honoring the life of Martin Luther King, Jr. on the latest episode of *CT-N Capitol Report: Week in Review*.

The [Executive and Legislative Nominations Committee](#) held confirmation hearings throughout the week for a number of individuals nominated for state positions – including Katherine Scharf Dykes for PURA Commissioner, former State Senator Rob Kane for Republican State Auditor, and Theodore Doolittle for the state's next Healthcare Advocate. After the Judiciary Committee held re-confirmation hearings last week, the [House of Representatives](#) and [State Senate](#) met in session Wednesday to take final action on the judges re-nominated to the bench by Governor Malloy.

*Capitol Report* will also review the [Mohegan Tribal Gaming Authority's](#) announcement on plans to redevelop the former Norwich Hospital site in Preston, as well as the [31st Annual Connecticut Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Ceremony](#) that took place at the State Capitol on Monday.

*Capitol Report: Week in Review* summarizes the activity at the State Capitol during the week, using voice over and graphics to combine history, context, and next steps in the process with full-length excerpts from the week's proceedings. The program premieres on CT-N every Friday night at 7:00 p.m., then rebroadcasts at Noon and 7:00 p.m. on Saturdays, 8:00 p.m. on Sundays, and 6:00 a.m. Monday mornings; check CT-N's online program schedule for additional airtimes. Each episode runs between 30 and 60 minutes.
